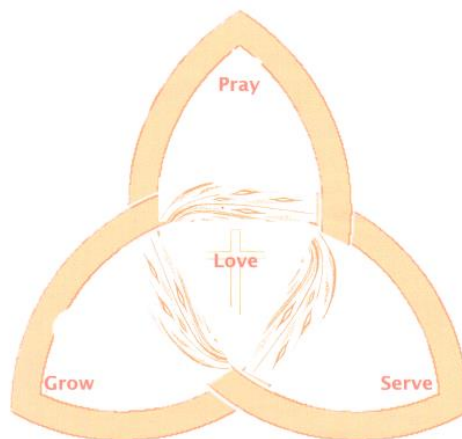

- a. KW added that, in addition to the Wardens' report on the Quinquennial report and subsequent work, some gutter has dropped off and will need replacing. Some bequests have been received but are mostly dedicated for Renewal project.

David Cook has asked that all changes to the heating system thermostat/timer be through him rather than changes be made by individuals.

- b. Electoral roll has increased by 5.
- c. DM – sidespeople will be elected by the PCC in future.
- d. DW – in addition to the account report, the general finances are low and it is increasingly important to receive the envelope giving. £5000 has been temporarily transferred/loaned from the renewal account to allow cashflow. NE – thanked DW for his comprehensive handover and for his past work. Bank account and signatory changes are still to be done. Thought needs to be given by the PCC regarding how to recoup the losses of the last year, especially Church Hall income. DM added that the use of the Church Hall to resource the community is equally important to consider.

Churchwarden's Report 2021-2022

We have yet another very busy year, working with the archdeacon's office to advertise and hopefully fill the rectors post while keeping up with repairs and other maintenance tasks, dealing with Covid19 and keeping services going.

Most building maintenance has been completed, including the clock, alarm and lightening conductor checks.

Much gratitude is due to the Deputy Wardens and treasurer without whose assistance we would find the tasks much more difficult.

Rectors Position

The last Rector, Revd Andy Lord left the Benefice in July 2019, and the Diocese decided to change the position to 'Priest-in-charge of the Transformational Change Appointment (time limited interim)' in line with new Church of England practices. There were no applicants during the first round of advertising. Then, In October 2021, the Diocese agreed to remove the time limited requirement, but due to a clerical error the advertising still retained that wording until the end of January 2022. The parish Representatives are meeting with Archdeacon Phil Williams on the 19th of April 2022.

Vandalism

On the 7th October 2022, we suffered quite considerable damage to the glass door, all the lights around the church, the lightening conductor and the memorial garden. Thanks to support from the police, the insurance company and local tradespeople, all the repairs were completed quite quickly. One side effect is that we now have modern, efficient lighting outside the church building.

Quinquennial including Tower work

The last Quinquennial inspection was carried out in June 2020 and the report called for some significant work to be carried out, but most of the work was significantly delayed because of the covid pandemic.

Notable items are;

Leaking guttering and downpipes, these had since got much worse and gratitude is due to David Wright for arranging and managing the replacement of all the guttering and related ironmongery for the chancel along with repairs to damaged or loose tiles on the roofs.

Broken or cracked window panes. These have all been attended to, along with repairs and new cords for the opening windows which has enabled the regular opening of windows for improved ventilation during services.

The tower south west corner, buttresses were shifting to one side at higher levels. On further investigation we also identified work required on long standing cracks up the inside of the spiral stair case. We are awaiting a full job schedule of works from our architect, but the cost is likely to be over £12,000.

Nottingham North Deanery Synod Report for Jan - Dec 2021

During 2021, as a result of COVID restrictions, we had a mix of in person, online and hybrid Synods.

Our first Synod, the first of this triennium, was online on 21st January. We admitted churchwardens and prayed and worshipped together. It was also Peter Huxtable's last Synod as Area Dean and Anne Walters' last Synod as Lay Chair.

At this Synod we also appointed our Deanery Leadership Team for the triennium:

We held a hybrid Synod on 21st July with some members meeting at Aspley, St Margaret's and others via YouTube. Our theme was missional opportunities for our parishes and we were joined by the following speakers:

Our final Synod of the year was held on 29th September at Stapleford, St Helen and we met wholly in person. During the evening we spent time sharing the challenges and opportunities in our parishes and praying for each other. We were also able to give Anne Walters a present to thank her for her many years as Lay Chair.

Our Deanery Prayer meetings have also continued on the first Tuesday of each month via Zoom.

We also had some other changes in leadership in the Deanery. Whilst Peter Huxtable stood down as Area Dean we were pleased he remained in the Deanery as Mission Associate at St Martha's, Broxtowe and Anne Walters also remained on the DLT after stepping down as Lay Chair. We said a fond farewell to David Gray following his retirement and to Sue Dunster who stepped down as Lay Chair at the end of December. We would like to thank you all for your generous and faithful giving during 2021. We may not have achieved payment of the full 100% of our parish share allocation but 95.8% in these difficult circumstances was fantastic! A special thank you to those parishes that paid over their allocation.

In 2022, we are looking forward to meeting and praying together in person!

Bell Ringing 2021-2022

This is the first report since the 2019 report, as the bells lay silent from March 2020 until April 2021, due to the Covid pandemic. The ringers did, however, meet up outside as and when the Covid rules allowed which gave some sort of continuity for the team.

During 2021 we rang for weddings and funerals. In April we rang to commemorate the life of HRH Prince Phillip, the husband of our Queen, and also for his funeral. July saw us ring in recognition of the 73rd anniversary of our NHS and to recognise the NHS being awarded the George Cross by our Queen in October. We rang for Remembrance Day in November and Christmas Day in December.

I am very pleased to report that the number of ringers we have has again increased. We now have 10 ringers.

Mike Semken has stepped in to continue training for the ringers, as Tom and Christine Langton ceased training during Covid. This new arrangement is working very well and it's a pleasure to see ringers thriving again.

Mike Semken also continues to carry out any maintenance work required for the bells. He again has done this free of charge.

We were able to join, with St. Helen's Stapleford ringers, in December for our Christmas meal bringing some form of normality to our diaries. During the year many bell ringing gatherings were cancelled.

Hopefully 2022 will enable us to participate in further activities with other towers.
